Easter themed activities

Ideas for things to do at home with your child.

Choose a couple of activities you would like to do at home with your child each day.

Make some chocolate nests with cereal. Decorate them with chocolate eggs. Send a photo to school.	Can you make some Easter chicks/rabbits shadow puppets?	Egg starts with the letter E. What else starts with the letter E? How many things can you think of?	Try making a model basket to hold some Easter treats. You could use an empty cardboard box and decorate it with pens or colourful Easter pictures.	Write a paragraph about how you celebrate Easter.
Be the teacher! Write your own Easter maths problems for someone in your family to solve. E.g I have 20 Easter eggs. I eat 3. How many do I have left?	Write your own Easter themed song and perform it to your family.	Use your school login and type "Easter" in the search bar on purple mash . There are lots of fun things to do on there.	How many bunny jumps and hops can you do in 2 minutes?	Make yourself some bunny ears! Take a photo and send it to school!
Help your grown up cook some eggs for breakfast, lunch or tea. Have them fried, scrambled or dippy!	Write the word EASTER down the side of a piece of paper. Can you write an acrostic poem? Each letter in "Easter" is the start of each new line.	At Easter time flowers start growing on the ground and in the trees. Go for a walk near your house (only if it safe to do so!) or in your garden and see what flowers you can see.	"Oh no!" The evil teacher has stolen all the Easter eggs! Here is an idea for an Easter story. Write your own adventure! Take a photo of your work and email it to school.	Turn a rock into an Easter Egg. Use paints or sharpies to decorate your rock!
Use your school login and type "Easter" in the search bar on Espresso . There are lots of fun things to do on there.	Make some Easter themed photo props. Take funny photos of you and your family.	Make your own "pin the tail on the bunny" game for your family. Use a scarf as a blindfold.	Have an egg and spoon race. Use a small ball as the egg and try and balance it on a spoon.	Make an Easter themed board game. Write your own rules and play it with your family.
Make your own Easter egg trail. Draw some Easter eggs on some paper. Next draw or write clues and put them around the house. Lead your family to your Easter picture!	Draw or paint an Easter picture - you could draw some Easter eggs, flowers, chicks or even the Easter bunny. You could use your fingers or draw a picture to help you.	Draw a 10 x 10 grid. Put the numbers 1 - 10 down the side and the letters A - J along the bottom. Draw some Easter eggs in the squares. Can you write down their co-ordinates?



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
