





4 activities a day

Year 2- Harry and His Bucketful of Dinosaurs

<p><u>Phonics activity</u> Look through your books and magazine how many words can you find with the prefix un? Can you think of anymore?</p>	<p>Read Harry and His Bucketful of Dinosaurs (All this week's activities are loosely based around it) https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=uWoopkMgLqM</p>	<p>Write a dinosaur alphabet! Can you find a name of a dinosaur for every letter of the alphabet?</p> <p>A B C</p>	<p>Write a dinosaur story! Think of some characters and a setting. Decide on a problem and how they will solve the problem! Email you story to school!</p>	<p>Try this maths problem:</p> <div data-bbox="1787 389 2092 592" style="border: 1px solid purple; padding: 5px;"> <p>The Tyrannosaurus Rex is two years older than the Pterodactyl. How old could they both be?</p>  </div>
<p><u>Phonics activity</u> Make some words cards for the au sound author, audio, haunt, dinosaur, August, launch Bury them in some soil or put them in a bag. Dig them up or pick them out one at a time and read them.</p>	<p>Make up a dinosaur song. Think of the different noises and actions that dinosaurs. e.g stomp, roar, swing their tails, bite, plod, flap their wings. Write your ideas down and then have a go at performing your song. Can you find anything in your house that could be an instrument?</p>	<p>Make a dinosaur costume! Use paper and string to design your own tail! Tie it round your waist when you are done.</p> 	<p>Make a dinosaur encyclopaedia. Research about different dinosaurs and create some fact files. Where did they live? What did they eat? What do they look like? Put your fact files together in a book.</p>	
<p>Solve this maths problem:</p> <div data-bbox="210 852 573 1098" style="border: 1px solid blue; padding: 5px;"> <p>Put 12 dinosaurs into the desert. Each desert must have 2 more dinosaurs than the one before.</p>  </div>	<p>Use a dinosaur toy to make some footprint biscuits! https://realfood.tesco.com/recipes/dinosaur-biscuits.html</p> 		<p>Make a volcano eruption. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=nFZhbEi19M8</p> <p>you need: bicarbonate of soda (white) vinegar Food colouring</p> <p>Put the Bicarbonate of soda in a glass, add the food colouring. Then pour on the vinegar and watch the eruption.</p>	
<p><u>Phonics activity</u> Play bingo - Write 6 split digraph words on a piece of paper. (e_e, i_e, a_e, o_e, u_e) Get your grown up to say some words. When they say your word cross it off. Shout bingo when you have all of them!</p>	<p>Fill a balloon with water. Pop a little toy inside. Ask a grown up to help you tie a knot in it. Put it in the freezer overnight. In the morning you will have your very own dinosaur egg! How will you get your toy out? (You could add food colouring to make different coloured eggs!)</p>	<p>Make a dinosaur swamp in your garden. Use a bowl or tray to put some water on. Add sticks, logs and grass.</p> 	<p>Dinosaur chaos! 



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Year 2- Harry and His Bucketful of Dinosaurs

<p>Solve this maths problem:</p> <p>Find 2 numbers next to each other that add up to 15.</p> 	<p>Write some dinosaur riddles.</p> <p>Give clues to describe your dinosaur without giving away its name. You could describe its colour, size, whether it eats plants or meat and where it lives. Then finish your riddle with "What am I?" Ask someone to guess!</p>	<p>Solve this maths problem:</p> <p>Put 17 eggs in 3 different nests. Each nest should have an odd number of eggs in them.</p> 	<p>Phonics activity</p> <p>Look through your books and magazine how many words can you find with the y (makes the ee sound, e.g. Harry, Mummy...) sound? Can you think of anymore?
