Nursery - The Rainbow Fish

<p>Read The Rainbow Fish (All this week's activities are loosely based around it) https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=I-EOvkGgM8k</p>	<p>Rainbow fish shared his scales with his friends. Find some coins and see if you can share them out between you and an adult. How many did you each get?</p>	<p>Sing '1,2,3,4,5 once I caught a fish alive' with your family.</p>	<p>Can you think of 5 animals that live in the ocean?</p>	<p>Find an old or blank CD and turn it into the Rainbow Fish by decorating it with craft bits, fins, a tail and eyes.</p>
<p>Chocolate can be rainbow colours like the rainbow fish. Grab some smarties, M&Ms or skittles. Sort out the different colours and say which colour has the most or least.</p>	<p>Make some masks for the story and act it out with your family.</p>	<p>Use some coloured paper and have a go at weaving your own rainbow fish.</p>	<p>Watch Andy's wild workouts- Under the sea on Iplayer and join in with the workout. What animals can you move like?</p>	<p>Gather some of your bath toys and play with them in a large bowl of warm, soapy water.</p>
<p>Invent another "rainbow" animal such as a rainbow bird or a rainbow butterfly. Draw a picture of your rainbow animal. What happens to the animal? Can you tell a grown up a story?</p>	<p>Rainbow fish had shiny scales. How many shiny objects can you find in your house? Can you find out why they are shiny?</p>		<p>Solve this maths challenge. The Rainbow fish had 4 blue scales. He gave 1 away. How many does he have left? You can use objects to help you.</p> 	
<p>Create a shoebox under the ocean scene. Make your own sea creatures and use string to dangle them down into your underwater scene.</p>	<p>Can you make a fish picture using 2D shapes? Can you tell a family member which shapes you used?</p>		<p>What was your favourite part of the story? Draw a picture and talk about what you have drawn.</p>	<p>Can you draw an octopus? How many tentacles does it have?</p>
<p>Can you tell a member of your family all of colours that you can see on the rainbow fish?</p>	<p>Practise counting to 10. Can you count slowly and then faster each time?</p>	<p>Look closely at the pictures in the story and think about what the characters were thinking and feeling in that picture.</p>	<p>Google Cosmic kids-under the sea. Join in with the under the sea themed yoga session.</p>	<p>Create a rainbow fish collage.
