



Reception – Pirates Love Underpants

4 activities a day

Ideas for things to do at home with your child.

Choose 4 activities you would like to do at home with your child each day.

<p><u>Phonics activity</u></p> <p>Look through your books and magazines how many words can you find with the ar sound? Can you think of anymore?</p>	<p>Read Pirates Love Underpants (All this week's activities are loosely based around it) https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=Vd8_Y1bEzA8</p>	<p>Draw a picture of your favourite part of Pirates Love Underpants. Can you write a sentence about your picture?</p>	<p>Can you use a template (cut some out) and create your own pattern on a pair of underpants? You can use paper, paint or crayons.</p>	<p>Write a menu for the pirates to eat. Be creative, will they have; Wooden leg of lamb, eye patch eggs etc.</p>
<p><u>Phonics activity</u></p> <p>Make some words cards for the ar sound <i>car, card, lard, park, jar, hard, market, farmyard</i> Can you think of any more? Bury them in some soil or put them in a bag. Dig them up or pick them out one at a time and read them.</p>	<p>Can you find some elastics? (don't take them out of your pants) See how far you and a family member can shoot them (best to do this outside). Use a shoe to measure how far they went. Whose went the farthest?</p>	<p>Find a stick. Make a mast and find something to make a sail (maybe some clean pants). Can you find something to use as a ship? (A box, washing basket, some blankets). Pretend you are a pirate and sail away. Where would you go? Find a place on a map (use Google if you don't have a map). How long do you think it would take you to get there?</p>	<p>Find something (teddy or a jewel) to hide in your garden (or house). Make a treasure map to see if someone can use it to find your treasure. Remember to use X to mark the spot.</p>	<p>Use a recycled box (or other recycled materials). Can you make your own 'pants of gold'? What colour will you colour/paint it?</p>
<p><u>Phonics activity</u></p> <p>Make some word cards for words with the diagraph ow. Make 2 for each word and then play a matching or memory game. <i>Now, down, how, town, bow, row, towel</i></p>	<p>Use the tune of 'wind the bobbin up'. Change the words to make a new pirate song for them to sing. (find the underpants, find the underpants, pull, pull, cut the strap)</p>	<p>Pretend you are a pirate and sail away. Where would you go? Find a place on a map (use Google if you don't have a map). How long do you think it would take you to get there?</p>	<p>Find some items that float and some that sink. Sort them. Make a boat that floats? Use recycled objects around the house. Can you see how many little figures (Lego) it can hold before sinking?</p>	<p>Pirates are not always nice to each other. These pirates stole from each other. Can you tell a grown up how to be kind? How would you treat a friend? Draw a picture of you and one of your friends being kind to each other.</p>
<p><u>Phonics activity</u></p> <p>Make some cards with oa words on <i>Coat, load, goat, road, soap, toad, boatman</i> Hid them around your garden or house. How quickly can you find and read them all? Can you beat your time?</p>	<p>Pirates sometimes sent messages to each other in a bottle. Write a message to a friend or family member, put it in a bottle (old water bottle) and go for a walk to put it on their door step.</p>	<p><u>Maths Challenge</u> – use some coins to help you. Pete the Pirate hid 7 pieces of treasure. He found 3. How many are still missing?</p>	<p>Research about Pirates. Write down 2 (or more) interesting facts. What do they wear? Where do they live? What do they eat?</p>	<p>Make a pirate patch and a cutlass out of paper or recycled cardboard. Pick your favourite part of <i>Pirates Love Underpants</i> and act it out. Can your family tell which part it is?</p>



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<p>Phonics activity</p> <p>Look through your books and magazine how many times can you find the trick words was, and or you</p> <p>Can you write a sentence using one of these words?</p>	<p>Go to https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/resources/phase/2/buried-treasure</p> <p>on a tablet, phone or computer. Play buried treasure. You should be doing phase 3 or 4.</p>	<p>Draw a picture to show your answer.</p>	<p>Draw a picture of a pirate wearing his/her favourite pair of underpants.</p> <p>Can you write some words to describe him/her. Tell a grown up a story about where the pirate goes and what they do. Maybe you could write the story?</p>	<p>Can you make a treasure chest out of recycled materials? Write numbers 1-20 on cards and put them in your chest. Have a family member pull one out and see how quickly you can say what number comes before and after (7 gets pulled out) You shout 6 and 8 as fast as you can!</p>
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
