# Choose 4 activities you would like to do at home with your child each day.

Year 1- Spyder

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Phonics activity  Look for words with the <b>ay</b> sound in. Look in books or magazines around your house.  Make a list. Can you think of anymore to add?	Read <b>Spyder</b> by Matt Carr All this week's activities are based loosely around this story. <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v</a> =ppCc2Nu5q7g	Cut out some spider shapes (or use raisins). Can you put them in groups of 2 and count how many you have? Count in 2s.  Now try putting them into groups of 10 and count in 10s.  What about groups of 5 and counting in 5s? Play a memory game such as pairs. You could play this on the computer or tablet or make your own. How about using all of Spyder's items in her kit bag!
Phonics activity  Make a word web for these tricky words.  her, she, into, of, with  Use each word in a sentence.	Write a spy kit list for Spyder. What does she need to be a spy? There are some ideas in the book but see if you can think of anymore.  Challenge: write a sentence for each item to say how she might use it.	Spyder's friend Ladybird likes to double numbers. All the ladybirds have the same number of spots on each side of their body. Draw some ladybirds and then their spots. Use your fingers or tweezers to rescue them. Draw a spider's web. Now draw 2 spiders on it. Write the multiplication fact 1x2=2	Find out about the lifecycle of a spider. Make a diagram to show the lifecycle.	Go on a minibeast hunt. How many spiders can you find?

Can someone in your house guess which minibeast you have chosen? Draw a picture as the answer.	Repeat the above activity but this time there are 5 spiders on each web. So the first one will be 1x5=5  Can you get all the way to 10x5?  What about if there are 10 spiders on each web? This would be the 10 times table (1x10=10).	Write an invisible message. Challenge: do they all make new words if you add ed, ing or er to the end. Make a list for each ending or real words and nonsense words.	Write some spider facts. Or find out about another minibeast and write facts about them.		Go outside and collect some sticks and leaves. Turn them into an insect or spider.	Spy's often wear a disguise.  Make yourself a disguise.  Use items you have at home or make a disguise using paper and pens. You could give yourself a moustache or some glasses. Take a photo to show how different you look.
