








Reception – Zog

4 activities a day

Ideas for things to do at home with your child.

Choose 4 activities you would like to do at home with your child each day.

Enjoy the film version of the story on BBC iplayer https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episode/b0bwdw8y/zog	Draw and label some pictures that will give instructions to teach the dragons how to look after Sir Gadabout's horse.	Can you make a castle? Use building blocks, Lego or recycled materials. Look at some pictures of castles to ensure you have all the parts you need (moat, turrets, draw-bridge)	Make a list of all the words that rhyme in the story. Can you think of anymore words to rhyme with each?	Have a go at some dragon themed yoga! https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=7NWzS2xziI4 												
Make up your own dragon themed game. For example: You could create a "pin the horn on the dragon" game. Draw a picture of a dragon and a horn separately. Then blind fold a member of your family and see if they can get the horn on the dragon.	Make your own dragon top trump cards. Ideas for things to do at home with your child.

Choose 4 activities you would like to do at home with your child each day.

The two human characters in the story become doctors. Can you plan some questions for an interview with a real doctor? What might you ask them?

Find a simple cupcake recipe and have a go at making your own dragon cupcakes. Try and weight the ingredients out yourself!



Paint or draw a picture of a dragon. Add colour and detail. You could even have a go at mixing your own colours if you are painting.

Make a poster to teach the dragons about fire safety.



Draw a map showing Zog's route to school. What does he pass on the way? See if someone at home can tell what you have drawn on your map.
