









4 activities a day

with your child.

Choose 4 activities you would like to do at home with your child each day.

Reception- Spyder

<p><u>Phonics activity</u></p> <p>Look for words with the ai sound in. Look in books or magazines around your house. Make a list. Can you think of anymore to add?</p>	<p>Read Spyder by Matt Carr</p> <p>All this week's activities are based loosely around this story. https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=ppCc2Nu5q7g</p>	<p>Cut out some spider shapes (or use raisins). Can you put them in groups of 2 and count how many you have? Count in 2s. Now try putting them into groups of 10 and count in 10s.</p> <p>Have a go at writing the numbers in 2's. 2, 4, 6</p>	<p>Use sticks and string to make a spiders web.</p>  <p>https://mothernatured.com/nature-crafts/stick-spider-web/?utm_medium=social&utm_source=pinterest&utm_campaign=tailwind_tribes&utm_content=tribes&utm_term=461115538_14950988_191030</p>	<p>Spy's need a good memory. Play a memory game such as pairs. You could play this on the computer or tablet or make your own. How about using all of Spyder's items in her kit bag!</p> 
<p><u>Phonics activity</u></p> <p>Make a word web for these tricky words. her, she, into, my, are</p>  <p>Use each word in a sentence.</p>	<p>Write a spy kit list for Spyder. What does she need to be a spy? There are some ideas in the book but see if you can think of anymore.</p> <p>Challenge: write a sentence for each item to say how she might use it.</p>	<p>Spyder's friend Ladybird likes to double numbers. All the ladybirds have the same number of spots on each side of their body. Draw some ladybirds and then their spots.</p> <p>Ladybird doubles. https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t-n-207-ladybird-doubles</p> 	<p>Put some minibeasts – paper or plastic – under the spider web you made above. Use your fingers or tweezers to rescue them.</p> 	<p>Make a bug hotel.</p> <p>https://www.redtedart.com/simple-bug-hotel-for-kids/</p> 



<p><u>Phonics activity</u></p> <p>How many words can you think of that have the oo sound in? Here's 2 to start you off. book, cook</p> <p>How many will you get on your list?</p> <p>Can you write a sentence using 2 of your words?</p>	<p>Make a fact file about a new criminal minibeast – like the fly one in the story.</p> 	<p>Draw a spider's web. Now draw 1 spider on each. Write the addition fact $1+1=2$</p> <p>Now draw 2 spiders webs with 1 spiders on each. What is the addition fact? Can you keep going until you get to $10+1$?</p>	<p>Find out about the lifecycle of a spider. Make a diagram to show the lifecycle.</p> <p>You might find this useful. https://www.twinkl.co.uk/resource/t-t-5253-spider-life-cycle-worksheets</p>	<p>Go on a minibeast hunt. How many spiders can you find? What other minibeasts did you find? Draw them.</p>
<p><u>Phonics activity</u></p> <p>Make some cards with the tricky words to, be, he, you, me</p> <p>Make 2 for each word. Then play a memory matching game.</p>	<p>Write a What am I? poem. Write clues to describe a minibeast. Can someone in your house guess which minibeast you have chosen? Draw a picture as the answer. I have ___ legs I can ____</p>	<p>Repeat the above activity but this time there are 2 spiders on each web. So the first one will be $1+2=3$</p> <p>Can you get all the way to $10+2=?$</p> <p>What about if there are 3 spiders on each web? Can you get up to $5+3=?$</p>	<p>Write an invisible message. Follow these instructions on how to make invisible ink - https://www.ehow.com/how_8416143_make-invisible-ink-heat.html</p> <p>Write someone in your house an invisible message.</p>	<p>Make a cake like the one in the story. Or just make something nice to eat. Would Bluebottle want to eat it? Remember he likes sweet treats!</p>
<p><u>Phonics activity</u></p> <p>ng</p> <p>write the words rang, bang, ring, sing, strong, wrong, rung, sung</p> <p>onto pieces of paper. Hide them around the house and then go on a word hunt.</p>	<p>Write some spider facts. Or find out about another minibeast and write facts about them.</p>		<p>Nature Art Insects</p>  <p>Go outside and collect some sticks and leaves. Turn them into an insect or spider.</p>	<p>Spy's often wear a disguise. Make yourself a disguise.</p> <p>Use items you have at home or make a disguise using paper and pens. You could give yourself a moustache or some glasses. Take a photo to show how different you look.</p>
