| Pirates are not always nice to each other. These pirates stole from each other. Can you tell a grown up how to be kind? How would you treat a friend? Draw a picture of you and one of your friends being kind to each other. | Pirates sometimes sent messages to each other in a bottle. Write a message to a friend or family member, put it in a bottle (old water bottle) and go for a walk to put it on their door step. | Maths Challenge Help to crack the pirate code! 46, 40, 34 What number comes next? Talk to your partner. | Research about Pirates. Write down as many interesting facts as you can find. What do they wear? Where do they live? Can your family tell which part it is? |
