# Punctuality

Doors for nursery are open 8:30-8:45 and 12:15-12:30 each day. Doors for school are open 8:45-8:55. Registers in school are taken at 8:55.

If you arrive and the door is closed you must go to the school office and sign your child in. School staff will take your child to school or nursery.

Thank you to all the parents who make sure their child is in school on time every day.

This week we have had a number of children arriving late each day. Please make every effort to get your child to school on time each day.

### Home learning

If your child needs to self-isolate then we will be in touch with you to organise delivery of a home learning pack. Activities will need to be



completed and the pack returned to school when your child returns to school. You can keep us up to date using Tapestry. It is really important that everyone is set up with Tapestyr so that we can keep in touch with you. If you are not yet set up



us and we can help you. You should also have received information about Letters and Sounds (phonics) sessions which are aviable on you-tube. There is more information on the school website. You can access these even if your child is attending school.

#### <u>Illness</u>

- Act quickly if your child is showing any signs of illness anyone showing symptoms (high temperature, new persistent cough, loss of taste/smell), adult or child, should not attend school / nursery or come on to the site.
- Anyone (child or member of staff) with symptoms will go home immediately and return following government guidelines
- Please notify the office if your child is absent. You must give us the reason for their absence as we are currently required to report certain symptoms.

#### Testing

• If your child or someone in your

household has symptoms they will need to be tested and everyone in your house will need to self-isolate.

- If you have children in more than one school you will need to collect all children straight away.
- If the test result is negative then you must email the result to us and we will contact you to confirm that your child can return.
- If the test is positive then self-isolation will need to continue for 14 days.

Please make sure you contact the office if your child is absent from school and nursery. It is vital that we know why children are absent so that we can keep everyone safe. Thank you.
